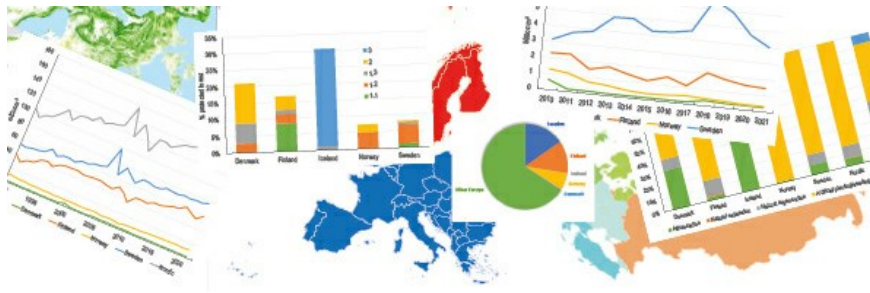

The Nordic Forest Statistics Report 2023 is published

The Nordic countries account for only 1.6% of the world's total forest area, however, it is an important percentage. Sweden and Finland contribute with 16% of the global exports of sawnwood products and paper, and 14% of pulp exports.
